3	3 January 1887	Holograph letter from +John Leahy, Newry, to Kirby: Asks for renewal of special faculties of Formula Sexta. 1p
4	3 January 1887	Holograph letter from Sr. M. Antonio, Dominican Convent, Dublin, to Kirby: Letter of thanks for beautiful prize sent by Pope. 4pp
5	5 January 1887	Holograph letter from +T. Power, St. John's, Newfoundland, to Kirby: Letter of salutation etc writer hopes that his student, John O'Reilly, is doing well. 4pp
6	5 January 1887	Holograph letter from Pauline Ch. Hehl, London, to Kirby: Writer begs Kirby to do something to stop Fr. Porter being sent to Bombay. He feels the heat badly, is getting old and is needed in England, while in India 'the heathens do not require such first rate theologians and preachers'. 4pp

9	8 January 1887	Holograph letter from +Barth. Woodlock, Longford, to Kirby: Regarding suggestions for celebrating Pope's Jubilee. Among other things the writer would like to send the Pope a length of white Irish poplin for his soutane to be worn on the day. 4pp
10	10 January 1887	Holograph letter from Patrick Ryan, Charleville, to Kirby: Once a student at the Irish College the writer left, chiefly owing to his inability to study due to ill health. He now feels certain that he has a vocation to the priesthood and asks Kirby for a recommendation to a college in Ireland, preferably All Hallows. 4pp
11	10 January 1887	Holograph letter from Rev. Humphrey O'Riordan, Waterville, to Kirby: Writer asks Kirby for help with a possible collection among English-speaking students in Rome. Fr, O'Riordan is trying to save something of 'The Liberator's' home, and also to make some provision for the family owing from Mr. O'Connell of Derrynane Abbey being declared bankrupt. Encloses appeal he proposes to have published in the press of England and Ireland. 2 items
12	10 January 1887	Holograph letter from Amelia Crosthwaite, Dun Laoghaire, to Kirby: Personal letter giving local news and encloses pound for Masses. 4pp
13	10 January 1887	Holograph letter from Rev. John Smith, P.P., Blacklion, to Kirby: Encloses application for a dispensation which Dr. Finegan hopes Kirby will obtain. Parties are poor but they send a pound. 2pp

19	14 January 1887	Holograph letter from +P. McAlister, Belfast, to Kirby: Encloses petition to be forwarded. Asks for ideas of how to celebrate Pope's Jubilee. Encloses ten pounds for Kirby. 4pp
20	14 January 1887	Holograph letter from Coadjutor Bishop [elect], Rathfriland, to Kirby: Acknowledges Kirby's letter. Receipt of official notification of his appointment as Coadjutor Bishop of Dromore, an appointment which he ascribes to Kirby's recommendation. Continues with account of how the writer has followed Kirby's advice with the result that he is on good terms with every one of his priests. 2pp
21	14 January 1887	Holograph letter from +Edward Thomas [of Limerick], Limerick, to 'My dear James': Personal letter - though to be shown to Dr. Carr - commiserates with 'James' on failure in 'begging'. 2pp

Explosion of dynamite off coast - blowing up an old hulk. Drought of past three years very hard on people. Sisters of St. Joseph still very trying. Any likelihood of Port Augusta being made into a See? This would greatly ease the work of the writer. 4pp
23	15 January 1887	Holograph letter from [Mrs.] R.E. White, 'Roche's Hotel', to Kirby: Letter concerns Fr. McGlynn's refusal to go to Rome to answer accusations that he is teaching anti-Church views on labour troubles. Public opinion in America, both Catholic and Protestant, will be against him. Writer encloses cutting from 'The Sun' of the previous December on Fr. McGlynn. [The writer of this letter is probably Rhoda White, sister of Dr. O'Reilly.] 2 items
24	15 January 1887	Holograph letter from Rev. Wm. O'Callaghan, C.C., Tralee, to Kirby: Encloses letter and article regarding movement begun to prevent home and relics of O'Connell from passing into hands of strangers. Feels that Kirby's sanction would be a great help. 3pp
25	15 January 1887	Holograph letter from +John MacCarthy, Cobh, to Kirby: Writer sends draft of £640 for Peter's Pence. Asks Kirby to convey also the great loyalty of diocese of Cloyne and sympathy for sorrow of Pope regarding persecution of Church. 4pp
26	16 January 1887	Holograph letter from Bishop Elect Thomas McGivern, Rathfriland, to Kirby: Writer thanks Kirby for letter and, as suggested, has written another letter to the Cardinal [copies of both letters given]. Explains in detail why he did not hold missions in his parish. Much surprised that the fact was reported to Rome. Asks Kirby's advice 'in confidence' regarding some money he has. 4pp

Having written to the Cardinal Prefect and settled the question of a fair, future rent, writer did not expect arrears to be mentioned. Gives details and asks Kirby to tell Cardinal that he will, of course, obey his instructions. 4pp
28	18 January 1887	Holograph letter from Rev. R.F. Conlan, 'Presbytery, Marlboro St.', to Kirby: Asks for papal blessing for child in very delicate health. 3pp
29	19 January 1887	Holograph letter from Rev. Alex. Henry, St. Leonards-on-Sea, to Kirby: Encloses newspaper cutting regarding fire at a church, giving details, also account of local conditions - asks Kirby's help in building new church of St. Thomas of Canterbury, etc. No one knows that he is writing. 2pp
30	19 January 1887	Holograph letter from P.V. Dwyer, West Maitland, to Kirby: Personal letter from an ex-student. Diocesan news etc. Asks for renewal of 'the usual Propaganda faculties'. 8pp
31	20 January 1887	Holograph letter from P.V. Hickey, Rome, to Kirby: Personal - thanking for tickets - regretting inability to dine at College. 1p

32	22 January 1887	Holograph letter from +William J. Walsh, Dublin, to Kirby: Regarding new method of making a collection suggested by Fr. Glynn, which the writer feels is a mistake. By common consent Bishops decided not to have a general collection on St. Patrick's Day or thereabouts, and now they will resent the course being taken as implying lack of goodwill and pressure from Holy See. Whole country dreadfully poor, people asking why build this new church at such a time priests feel that it will not be a national church as it will be in the hands of Fr. Glynn's Order. Had suggestion for way out, but not feasible. Mentions new church at Maynooth, not opened though completed by builders five or six years ago - cost £20,000, and not possible to ask people for more. Wishes letter to be shown to Fr. Glynn. 4pp
33	22 January 1887	Holograph letter from +William J. Walsh, to Kirby: Regarding difficulties over Royal University, with formerly two Bishops nominated to the Senate, it being understood that Bishops should be chosen by the Hierarchy and then 'nominated' by the Lord Lieutenant. Things did not work out like that. Finally, a place falling vacant, the Lord Lieutenant has nominated Bishop O'Dwyer of Limerick, not only the junior Bishop, but one who has often shown a marked disposition to act for himself. Matter extremely important, touching as it does on positions on Education Boards etc. Begs Kirby's help. [Letter marked 'Confidential', also 'Kindly destroy this when read'.] 4pp
34	22 January 1887	Holograph letter from +Thomas I. Carr, Dublin, to Kirby: Writer is on his way to Rome. Will write again when able to give definite date of arrival 1p
35	22 January 1887	Holograph letter from William O'Grady, Patrickswell, to Kirby: Encloses three pounds for 47 Masses with detailed instructions. 4pp

37	22 January 1887	Holograph letter from Joseph Lavery, Belfast, to Kirby: Regarding money expected which has not yet been received - explains delay as estate is in Chancery, etc. [Note- Mr. Lavery borrowed ten pounds from Kirby when in desperate need, promising to repay when he came into possession of a hundred pounds from the estate.] 2pp
38	22 January 1887	Holograph letter from +P. Moran, Dunedin, to Kirby: Writer asks Kirby's advice about his position as shareholder in Company owning Catholic paper of which he is Editor - also position of priests likewise shareholders. All profits go to charitable purposes, but now fears he has broken Canon Law. Gives details. Diocesan news. 4pp
39	23 January 1887	Holograph letter from Rev. Patrick Barton, Listowel, to Kirby: Enclosing recommendation from Bishop in order to obtain faculties for blessing beads. 3pp
40	24 January 1887	Holograph letter from +L. Gillooly, Sligo, to Kirby: Writer is pleased about erection of Church of St. Patrick in Rome and that Pope is taking so practical an interest in Fr. Glynn's undertaking. Collection from Ireland should be good, since although individuals can give little, the total from all will be large. 3pp
41	24 January 1887	Holograph letter from +P. Power, Coadjutor, Waterford, to Kirby: At the request of the Bishop the writer acknowledges Kirby's letter and informs him that a collection for the new Church of St. Patrick in Rome will be held on 17 March. Encloses application for dispensation. 3pp

43	25 January 1887	Holograph letter from +Francis Kelly, Derry, to Kirby: Writer will do what he can regarding collection for new church in Rome, but people very poor, suffering from bad harvest, high rents and taxes. 2pp
44	25 January 1887	Holograph letter from Mother Abbess, Skiddaway, to Kirby: Writer [Poor Clare Collettine] tells Kirby of her troubles and of dissensions among Benedictines - begs him to lay everything before the Pope and get his protection for her. 12pp
45	26 January 1887	Holograph letter from Rev. Edmond Thomas, P.P., V.F., Athenry, to Kirby: Asks for renewal of faculties for blessing beads. 1p
46	26 January 1887	Holograph letter from +Bernard Finegan, Cavan, to Kirby: Dates named by Pope for collection towards new church in Rome are those fixed 'for years' for Peter's Pence. Bishop is therefore compelled to postpone the new collection until May, when he will do what he can. 2pp
47	27 January 1887	Holograph letter from +Peter McIntyre, Charlottestown, to Kirby: Writer encloses application for title of Monsignor to be conferred on his V.G Asks for power of delegation of some faculties since he is now old and 'much broken in health'. A few days previously he sent \$200 towards expenses of Pope's Jubilee and now sends Peter's Pence \$462.12. 2pp

50	28 January 1887	Holograph letter from +William J. Walsh, Dublin, to Kirby: Recommending the Viscontess Maidstone, shortly to visit Rome - gives some details concerning her - Dr. Murphy is laid up. 2pp
51	28 January 1887	Holograph letter from +T. O'Callaghan, Cork, to Kirby: Writer assures Kirby there is no difficulty regarding cooperating in the erection of St. Patrick's Church in Rome. People pleased to help. Gives news of diocese - general mission in all churches of city - happy termination of disunion among clergy. Seminary to be ready next May for 40 students - appointed as Rector a young priest educated in Rome though not at the Irish College - difficulty in renting suitable episcopal house so it has been arranged to have half new seminary as such. 4pp
52	29 January 1887	Holograph letter from +Peter McIntyre, Charlottetown, to Kirby: After sending his previous letter writer received further money for Peter's Pence, which he hastens to send. 1p

Apparently hopes for a collection from various people as she asks Kirby to let her have the names or at least the number of those who contribute so that she may send an individual acknowledgement to each. 4pp
55	30 January 1887	Holograph letter from +John MacEvilly, Tuam, to Kirby: While any wishes of the Pope must be complied with, writer would like to say that 'Dr. Glynn has suggested to the Holy Father the most inopportune time for a money collection' for a new Irish church in Rome. This is as far as Tuam is concerned and this applies also, he thinks, to other dioceses. Resolution at general meeting in September that while support would be given as far as possible, a collection this year was 'not' possible, the people being on the verge of bankruptcy and suffering from greatest depression ever remembered. Gives details of other collections always made each year. 4pp
56	31 January 1887	Holograph letter from Rev. John Smith, P.P., Blacklion, to Kirby: Writer reminds Kirby that three or four weeks before, on the direction of his Bishop, he asked Kirby to obtain a dispensation in kindred, enclosing a pound and asking for the matter to be expedited. No reply has been received. Matter very urgent. [see KIR/1887/13] 2pp
57	31 January 1887	Holograph letter from +P. McAlister, Belfast, to Kirby: Delighted to help with new Irish church in Rome, but writer goes on to give details of terrible hardships being endured by Irish people, and all the other collections taken up. Will send their contribution 'in due time'. Thanks for dispensation granted. 6pp

Brownrigg, Kilkenny, to Kirby: While anything coming from the Pope will always have writer's 'most respectful attention and support', it is impossible for him to raise a collection this year for the proposed Irish church in Rome. Gives details of money needed to be raised in diocese this year and also points out that he is surrounded by thousands of poor people 'who don't know in the morning when they get up where they are going to get their breakfast'. Writer is sure that St. Patrick would not be pleased if he added more burdens. Later on he hopes to give his own contribution when the church is in course of erection. 4pp
59	31 January 1887	Holograph letter from + Edward Thomas, Bishop of Limerick, Limerick, to Kirby: Regarding proposed collection for Irish church in Rome, does not think it possible this year, which is a very bad one for the Irish people - if, however, the Pope does not wish it postponed, writer will do his best. Thanks for faculties. 4pp
60	31 January 1887	Holograph letter from + William Fitzgerald, Skibbereen, to Kirby: Regarding new Ross boundary - to some extent reassuring - writer thinks it necessary for Propaganda to issue special instruction for National Council. If necessary, writer is prepared to come to Rome in this connection. 3pp
61	31 January 1887	Holograph letter from +John MacCarthy, Cobh, to Kirby: Regarding proposed collection for church in Rome - while every wish of the Pope is equivalent to a command, writer would point out that the present year is a very unfavourable time for it. After a bad harvest many people are terribly poor - also 'it would give the Landlords a pretext, which they would be sure to use, for proclaiming that the farmers cannot be too badly off' if they can afford to contribute. As church in Rome will not be begun for another year, writer asks for collection to be deferred. 6pp

74	6 February 1887	Holograph letter from Rev. John Smith, P.P., Blacklion, to Bishop Finegan: Regarding marriage dispensation applied for - writer thinks that Rome does not understand the circumstances - girl will 'have to emigrate to a foreign country' if dispensation is not granted. As Bishop is now in Rome, writer hopes that he will endeavour to get the dispensation as soon as possible, explaining that when writing to Kirby he enclosed a pound. 3pp
75	6 February 1887	Holograph letter from +T. O'Callaghan, Cork, to Kirby: Writer asks Kirby whether the rumour is true that there are to be portions of Cork, Kerry and Cloyne linked with Ross. 79	8 February 1887	Holograph letter from Rev. Terence O'Reillly, Killeshandra, to Kirby: Writer asks advice as to procedure in laying his case before Propaganda. Gives detailed account of what happened to him in the West Indies and later, and of the treatment of him by the Abp. of Port of Spain. 3pp
80	9 February 1887	Holograph letter from +N. Donnelly [], Dublin, to Kirby: Introducing Gerald Fitzgerald, visiting Rome. 3pp
81	10 February 1887	Holograph letter from +Bernard Finegan, Genova, to Kirby: Writer is on way to Rome, but travelling slowly because of ill health. On arrival he will be seeking Kirby's advice. 3pp

Mentions 'unfortunate letter on the Parnell Testimonial' wherein one of the statements was that crime and outrage were never denounced by the Parnellite party, and goes on to point out that in an English Court 'last week' a 'continuous and relentless denunciation of crime on the part of that same Parnellite Party' was produced before the whole world. Kirby will understand how painful it is to hear Rome charged with acting on one-sided information, of sacrificing justice to political expediency, and to be confronted with a fact like the above 'which makes reply impossible'. In December last the Irish Bishops addressed a joint letter to the Pope, congratulating him on the service done to the Church by his Encyclical 'De Libertate', and protesting against new penal code. The 'Osservatore' has published similar protests from hierarchies of various countries, including that of England and, latterly, it has begun to publish protests from individual dioceses, but no notice whatever has been taken of the Irish hierarchy. How, in face of this, is one to reply to the taunt that Rome takes 'our service, takes our Peter's Pence and other pledges of devotion, but cares nothing for us ...'. Probably the incident is due to an oversight by some official, but such an explanation would be laughed at in Ireland. It will be some time before the Irish bishops address a similar letter to the Pope. Regarding the Jubilee gifts, at a meeting of the bishops at which blank disappointment and astonishment was expressed that 'anything so poor should come to the country as a Papal gift' ... the effect on the people was discussed and how to thank the Pope without implying that the gifts deserved any gratitude. Furthermore, as a result of persevering effort the material of the vestments from Dublin, and probably this applied to the whole country, and of the lining is as prescribed, and 'large success had been attained in generalising the use of Roman vestments'. But hardly a Roman vestment is to be found among the gifts from Rome, while in nearly every case the lining is such as 'it has been deemed a duty to reject here'.
